

City Council
Regular Meeting
September 23, 2003

The City Council of the City of Titusville, Florida met in regular session on Tuesday, September 23, 2003 in the Council Chamber of City Hall, 555 South Washington Avenue, beginning at 6:30 p.m.

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Present were Mayor Ron Swank, Vice-Mayor Jeff Rainey, Council Members Chris Broome, Conrad Eigenmann, and Ken Ward. Also in attendance were City Manager Tom Harmer, City Attorney Dwight Severs, and Assistant City Clerk Wanda Wells.

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Mayor Swank called the meeting to order. Reverend Jim Govatos, Pastor of Indian River City Methodist Church, gave the invocation. The Webelos Scout Troup Pack No. 367 from St. Teresa's Church led the audience in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

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Mayor Swank advised Ordinance 53-2003 rezoning property at 341 Jepson Street from single-family high density residential to multi-family high density residential would not be heard. Ruby Rhodes, applicant and property owner, withdrew her application.

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The first matter of business was approval of minutes of regular meeting August 12 and 26, 2003 and special meetings August 19, 2003 and September 11, 2003. Mayor Swank offered the following correction to the August 26, 2003 minutes. During the discussion regarding Ordinance No. 33-2003 amending the shoreline mixed use district, strike through words "including school board property" so the sentence should read: Discussion continued whether two properties would be grandfathered in ordinance and there was no consensus. Vice-Mayor Rainey moved to approve the minutes as corrected. Member Broome seconded the motion and it carried unanimously.

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Mayor Swank recognized Larry Bartley, former Titusville mayor, who was present in the audience.

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Special Recognitions Mayor Swank presented proclamations to Fire Chief Rick Talbert declaring October 5 - 11, 2003 as "Fire Prevention Week" and October 19, 2003 as the date for observance

of "Fallen Firefighters Memorial" in Titusville. Chief Talbert extended invitation to Fallen Firefighters Memorial Service to be held on October 19, 2003 at the Fire Department Headquarters.

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Presentations Member Linda Haas presented the North Brevard Library Board's semi-annual report highlighting activities for children held during the summer months and upcoming events. Mayor Swank asked Ms. Haas to make dates of upcoming events available to city clerk and requested these dates be advertised on channel 99.

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Chairman Dean Pettit presented the Titusville Environmental Commission's semi-annual report of activities during the past six months. Mr. Pettit asked for council's endorsement of an Environmental Awareness Awards initiative, which would include a monetary award. City Manager was directed to review this request and report back to council. Chairman Pettit announced a public workshop sponsored by Brevard County Department of Natural Resources on October 9, 2003 in the Council Chamber to discuss Significant Environmental Areas ordinance and encouraged council and staff to attend.

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Vice-Mayor Rainey moved to accept the North Brevard Library Board's semi-annual report and the Titusville Environmental Commission's semi-annual report. Member Broome seconded the motion and it carried unanimously.

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Economic Development Director Walt Johnson brought council up to date on economic development projects, including the prospect for a hotel at Vector Space and a pending contract on the Hughes property, etc. Assistant Karen Steil reviewed marketing and public relations initiatives, especially relating to the divisions Internet presence.

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Consent Agenda Mayor Swank requested consent items A & B be voted on as a separate motion. Council agreed. Member Broome moved to approve items A and B in accordance with the following recommendations:

- A. Approve deed restrictions for Titusvillage Section XII. Recommendation: Approve deed restrictions as submitted.
- B. Approve final plat and deed restrictions for Titusvillage Section XIII, a single-family subdivision located at the northern terminus of both Blueberry Drive and Date Drive. Recommendation: Approve final plat and deed restrictions for Titusvillage Section XIII.

Member Eigenmann seconded the motion it passed unanimously. Member Ward abstained, as there was a potential conflict of interest.

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Member Broome moved to approve items C and D in accordance with the following recommendations:

- A. Authorize use of forfeiture funds to purchase Megavox portable public address system for Police Department at a cost of \$920. Recommendation: Authorize purchase from Discount Audio, Inc. of Torrance, California using forfeiture funds.
- B. Approve collective bargaining agreement with Laborers' International Union of North America (LIUNA) for Fiscal Years 2003/2004, 2004/2005, and 2005/2006. Recommendation: Authorize execution of agreement.

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Petitions and Requests from the Public Present William Hall suggested that the reverse side of a traffic signal on a divided one-way road (such as U.S. Highway One) contain a signal/message that it was a one-way road. Member Eigenmann moved to direct city manager to investigate the idea and report back to council. Member Broome seconded the motion and it carried unanimously.

Geri Sigmores urged council to re-enact the additional homestead exemption for seniors. Vice-Mayor Rainey advised that this item would be on the October 28, 2003 agenda.

Susan Canada showed pictures of Marina Road and results of her background investigation on VectorWorks and a related conditional use permit. Member Broome moved to direct city manager to look into her allegations and report back. Member Eigenmann seconded the motion and it carried unanimously.

Joan Wheeler asked for clarification on the proposed millage rate and budget for Fiscal Year 2003/2004. Vice-Mayor Rainey asked staff to prepare an explanation on calculation of the roll-back millage rate for the budget meeting on September 25, 2003.

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The meeting recessed at 7:40 p.m. and reconvened at 7:50 p.m.

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Ordinances-Second Reading, Public Hearings and Related Action Attorney Severs read ORDINANCE NO. 36-2003 OF THE CITY OF TITUSVILLE, FLORIDA, AMENDING THE CODE OF ORDINANCES BY AMENDING SECTION 21-280 BY CHANGING THE DEFINITION OF REUSE SERVICE AREA AND REUSE SERVICE DISTRICT; AMENDING SECTION 21-284 BY CLARIFYING CERTAIN TERMINOLOGY; AMENDING SECTION 21-290 BY AMENDING SUBSECTION (c) REGARDING CONNECTION OF EXISTING SINGLE FAMILY HOMES AND SUBSECTION (e) REGARDING AVAILABILITY OF REUSE LINES; AMENDING SECTION 21-290 BY ESTABLISHING A NEW SUBSECTION (h) BY PROVIDING FOR THE INSTALLATION OF REUSE TRANSMISSION MAINS AND IMPOSITION OF A CONNECTION FEE AND ESTABLISHING THE PROCESS AND PROCEDURE FOR IMPOSING SAID FEE; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE the second time by title only.

Water Resources Director Raynetta Grant reviewed the proposed changes within the ordinance that would support the goal that refines service district, reuse district being redefined as an area of critical concern; and identifying a cost of infrastructure.

Mayor Swank opened the public hearing. No one wished to speak and the public hearing was closed.

Vice-Mayor Rainey requested tabling ordinance in order to have additional time for review. Member Eigenmann moved to table Ordinance No. 36-2003 to the October 14, 2003 meeting. Member Broome seconded the motion and it carried unanimously.

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City Attorney Severs read ORDINANCE NO. 45-2003 OF THE CITY OF TITUSVILLE, FLORIDA AMENDING SECTIONS 39-664, 59-302, 59-304, 59-322, 59-324, 59-342, 59-344, 59-362, 59-364, 59-382, 59-384, 59-544, 59-662, 59-664, 59-702, AND 59-704 OF THE LAND DEVELOPMENT REGULATIONS BY REMOVING CONDITIONAL USES FOR DRIVE-IN/DRIVE-THROUGH FACILITIES; PROVIDING GENERAL PERFORMANCE REQUIREMENTS FOR SAME; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE the second time by title only. The Planning and Zoning Commission recommended approval. The first public hearing before city council was September 9, 2003.

Mayor Swank opened the public hearing. No one wished to speak and the public hearing was closed.

Member Ward requested that staff review the Land Development Regulations in order to make necessary corrections regarding redundancies, etc. Member Broome moved to adopt Ordinance No. 45-2003. Member Eigenmann seconded the motion and the roll call was:

The Planning and Zoning Commission recommended approval.

Mayor Swank opened the public hearing. No one wished to speak and the public hearing was closed.

Member Broome moved to adopt Ordinance No. 54-2003. Vice-Mayor Rainey seconded the motion. Member Eigenmann requested clarification whether funding was shown in the proposed budget for fiscal year 2003/2004. City Manager responded if ordinance were approved, the additional sum of \$4,000 would be reflected in the city clerk's budget for fiscal year 2003/2004. The roll call was:

EFFECTIVE DATE the second time by title only. The Planning and Zoning Commission recommended approval.

Mayor Swank opened the public hearing.

Roger Molitor asked council to approve Ordinance No. 55-2003 and asked for review of required exhibits pertaining to annexations, etc. within the code. He also asked council to do everything in its power to encourage property owners to annex into the City of Titusville.

No one else wished to speak and the public hearing was closed.

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Next was Conditional Use Permit No. 11-2003 to allow a recycling center at 4475 South Street. The Planning and Zoning Commission tabled this petition so that the applicant could provide a site plan of the property showing the proposed layout. Planning staff received the site plan on September 12, 2003 and was asking council to table item until the October 14, 2003 meeting. Vice-Mayor Rainey moved to table Conditional Use Permit 11-2003 to the October 14th meeting. Member Ward seconded the motion and it carried unanimously.

Council members disclosed whether they had spoken to property owners or driven by property at 2500 Merry Lane.

Mayor Swank opened the public hearing.

Anthony Berman, applicant, asked council to approve Ordinance Nos. 48-2003 and 49-2003. Mr. Berman stated that he was currently working with the Airport Authority and that they supported his proposed project for construction of a facility that would be used in the sales, manufacturing of airframe components and the assembly of sports and ultra light aircraft for use by enthusiasts of experimental sport aviation. Mr. Berman also advised there would be no outside storage building and property would remain within current codes.

Council expressed concern with changing land use and rezoning for property at 2500 Merry Lane. A few of their concerns were related to residential property owners in the area as well as future property owners.

Mark Oriza supported Mr. Berman's proposed project and requested council's approval of Ordinance Nos. 48-2003 and 49-2003. Mr. Oriza encouraged growth and did not feel as though this facility would create any additional traffic for surrounding property owners.

Joe Moran and John Demello supported growth within the community, but were concerned with allowing the type of facility near a residential neighborhood. They also expressed concern with not receiving notification of the public hearing for the land use change and rezoning of 2500 Merry Lane and that there was no sign posted on the property to notify surrounding property owners of the proposed change. Mr. Moran and Mr. Demello requested council take additional time to review the request.

Paul Turner was not in support of the land use change and rezoning for 2500 Merry Lane and asked council not to support the request.

Peter Smircich supported Mr. Berman proposed project and requested council's approval of Ordinance Nos. 48-2003 and 49-2003.

No one else wished to speak and the public hearing was closed.

Vice-Mayor Rainey moved to table Ordinance Nos. 48-2003 and 49-2003 to the October 14, 2003 meeting. Member Eigenmann seconded the motion and it carried four to one with Member Broome opposed. Member Ward recommended Mr. Berman discuss proposed project with property owners surrounding 2500 Merry Lane. Mayor Swank asked city manager to come back

to council with additional information on project. City Manager Harmer stated that a sign would be posted on the property prior to next public hearing scheduled for October 14th.

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Mayor Swank advised citizens that the comprehensive plan citizen courtesy information sign-up sheet was available for all citizens wishing to receive information concerning the date of publication of the notice of intent by the Department of Community Affairs.

Kevin Panik commented on the walkway along Sisson Road and asked that the walkway from Highway 50 to Highway 405 be extended. Mr. Panik commented on the median beautification project and the enchanted forest. He also commented on property owners that live near airports.

No one else wished to speak and the public hearing was closed.

Member Broome moved to adopt Ordinance No. 51-2003, Ordinance No. 52-2003, and Ordinance No. 50-2003. Vice-Mayor Rainey seconded the motion and the roll call was:

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Petitions and Requests from the Public Present Joan Wheeler discussed budgetary issues, particularly funding for the Community Redevelopment Agency.

Susan Canada discussed the plans for Marina Park. She stated that council designed a beautiful parking lot but not a park.

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Boards and Commissions North Brevard Library District Board - The terms of Linda Haas, Eugenia Kolodney, and William Schafer, regular members, expired the end of the month. Council appointment was for a two-year term. There was also a vacancy to appoint a regular member for a term expiring September 30, 2004. Vice-Mayor Rainey moved to re-appoint incumbents for a term expiring September 30, 2005 and appoint Walter Santschi for the vacant term expiring September 30, 2004. Member Eigenmann seconded the motion and it carried unanimously.

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George Mosakowski, member of the Titusville Environmental Commission requested a ten-week leave of absence. Vice-Mayor Rainey moved to approve leave of absence. Member Broome seconded the motion and it carried unanimously.

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Mayor and Council Reports Mayor Swank provided written report on his activities since the last meeting.

Member Broome advised that he returned to the family's law practice in Titusville.

Individual council members shared personal comments relating to the remembrance of September 11, 2001.

Member Eigenmann commended the Titusville Police Department for its handling of a recent theft involving his local dealership.

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City Manager's Report Council acknowledged receipt of the city manager's written report.

City Manager Harmer read the names of employees receiving letters of appreciation.
